LF	Landfill Directive	EA	Sets challenging targets for reductions of biodegradable municipal waste to landfill, introduces classification for landfill sites, specifies that only treated wastes will be accepted and bans the disposal of specified wastes. e.g. liquids, tyres, as well as co-disposal. Implementation of later commenced in July 2004.	Hazardous wastes will only be accepted at authorised Landfills, None in Wales so increased costs of disposal. Wider range of wastes that are considered ie fluorescent tubes.
LG	Regulation on Substances That Deplete the Ozone Layer 1994 (EEC/3093/94)	EA	Places controls and phase-out dates on the manufacture and supply of substances including CFCs, halons, carbon tetrachloride, 1,1,1 - trichloroethane, HBFCs and HCFCs, and control on the manufacture and supply of methyl bromide. 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LH	Water Resources Act 1991	EA	<p>The Water Resources Act 1991 (WRA 1991) was amended by the Environment Act 1995, but remains the principal legislation regarding discharges to controlled waters.</p> <p>It is an offence to cause or knowingly permit any poisonous, noxious or polluting matter or any solid waste matter to enter controlled waters.</p>	Dulwich College Field Centre has a duty to prevent pollution of any watercourses.
LI	Salmon and Freshwater Fisheries Act 1975	EA	It an offence to discharge effluent into controlled waters which will result in damage to fish, their food, spawn or spawning grounds.	We are located near the Afon Tawe, and our septic tanks have soak away systems in to nearby fields
LJ	Anti-Pollution Works Regs. 1999	EA	Enable Environment Agency to serve notice on a polluter or potential polluter to remedy or prevent water pollution	Dulwich College Field Centre has not been subject to previous pollution problems in relation to these regs.
LK	Water Act 2003	EA	Procedures relating to applications for abstraction licences	We do not abstract water from boreholes nor natural watercourses, but we are aware of the need to obtain abstraction licences, if in the future, the need arises.


LL	<p>The Environmental Protection Act 1990 Part IIA (as amended under part II of the Environment Act 1995).</p> <p>Contaminated Land (Wales) Regs. 2001.</p>	LA/ EA	<p>Provides statutory framework for contaminated land.</p> <p>LA are required to identify contaminated land within their areas, with "Special Sites" being regulated by the EA. Identified sites are to be cleaned to a "suitable for use " standard, with remediation Notices being served on the person who originally caused the contamination, advocating the "Polluter Pays Principle ". If this person cannot be found, then the owner/occupier will be held responsible.</p>	We are not aware of any contamination to the land.

LM	Environmental Protection Act 1990, Part III	LA	Enables local authorities and private individuals to take action to secure abatement of nuisances such as noise, odours, dust etc	Dulwich College Field Centre is located away from the main road and noise sensitive areas, and has not been subject to any nuisance complaints.	
LN	Noise and Statutory Nuisance Act 1993	LA	Concerned with street noise from sources such as vehicles, equipment, machinery and burglar alarms. Also deals with the recovery of expenses incurred by the local authority in abating statutory nuisance.

LO	Town and Country Planning Legislation  Planning (Listed building and Conservation Areas) Act 1990	LA	Conditions on type of development permitted e.g. visual aspects (appearance of buildings) and noise etc.  Requires compilation of a list of buildings of special interest (historical or architectural). Specific consent is required to demolish, alter or extend such a building. Provides for creation of conservation areas of special historic interest (cities, towns or villages) and that such status is taken into account in the assessment of planning applications.	We do not have any plans to carry out building work at present. But we are aware of this legislation and the need to comply.	
LP	Health and Safety at Work Act 1974  Control of Substances Hazardous to Health (COSHH Regs)	LA/HSE	Provides a comprehensive integrated regulatory system to protect health, safety and welfare of workers.  Safe handling/storage/use and transportation of substances hazardous to health.	All on site chemicals and cleaning agents are adequately stored.	
LQ	Climate Change Levy	Customs & Excise	Introduced in 2001 as a tax on energy use in industry, commerce and the public sector, with offset cuts in National Insurance Contributions and with additional support for energy efficiency schemes and renewable sources.	Dulwich College Field Centre is not subject to climate change levy as the electric used by the business mainly for domestic use in the house.	

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<b>FORTHCOMING and PROPOSED LEGISLATION</b>		
LR	Oil Storage Regs	Will apply to storage of more than 200 litres of oil above ground on industrial premises. All tanks to be bunded to 100% capacity. New stores to comply within 6 months of regs. In force existing within 5 years (2 yrs if “significant risk”).  Implemented in England in 2001; imminent in Wales.
LS	<b>Waste Electrical and Electronic Goods</b> WEEE Directive	Proposal to require manufacturers to bear the cost of recovery and treatment of such goods now split into two separate directives on waste recovery and restrictions on the use of hazardous substances, with a third directive dealing with standards for design and manufacture of the equipment.
